

# The Gospel of Luke – Extraordinary Invitation

### Summary

- In the series on Luke we have explored how Jesus fulfilled the prophecy in Isaiah 61 bringing freedom and healing to those society has overlooked. He often did this through eating and drinking through being at parties. The parable in Luke 14 extends an extraordinary invitation for us to join the Kingdom party.
- To be invited into God's loving presence as fallen humans is an extraordinary invitation. And the danger is that we can get used to something that is actually quite extraordinary. Life can get in the way. And when the time comes to respond to this invitation, to fully engage with the Kingdom, we can struggle with finding the space in our lives just like the party guests in the parable.
- Through the presence of the Holy Spirit we can have an intimate relationship with Jesus in our lives and we can respond to his invitation, welcoming us into community, to live a life full of expectancy for Kingdom breakthrough and to become a co-host with Him and invite others to join in.
