

Who Is This Man...Who Forgives Us?

Date: 15th September 2019 **Speakers:** Tony Bunker and Jeff Stamps

Key Verses: Mark 2:1-12

Talk Summary:

- This passage shows that to Jesus there is a close link between healing and forgiveness, this is also demonstrated elsewhere eg Matthew 11 verse 1-5 and in the Old Testament Psalm 103 verse 2-3, Psalm 41 verse 4.
- Jesus is always intending to deal with the works of the enemy sin and sickness he comes that we might have life and life to the full (John10 verse 10)
- There is an aspect to corporate faith that encourages healing Jesus saw their faith (verse 5)
- Whilst acknowledging the reality of the 'now and not yet of the Kingdom' we need to be careful that we don't lower our expectations for God to move miraculously to heal
- God will forgive our sins if we decide to change the direction of our lives to follow him (repent), if Jesus forgave those who were executing him there is nothing we've done that he won't forgive
- Once we've asked his forgiveness we need to stop beating ourselves up about things we've done Psalm 103 verse 12 "As far as the east is from the west so far has he removed our transgressions from us",
 Acts 10 "do not call anything impure that God has made clean"
- We are also commanded to forgive as we have been forgiven (Matthew 18 verse 21 onwards).
 Forgiveness benefits us who forgive
- Forgiveness isn't forgetting, it's not a feeling (though it will lead to changes in feelings), it's not saying what happened was OK or that there won't be any consequences, it's not always a one off sometimes it has to be repeated many times, its not the same as reconciliation.
- Forgiveness is a choice we make with God's help, Dr Gerry Breshears definition: "The personal act to release the one who sinned against me from my personal right to collect on the moral debt, to pay them back for their offence. Instead of giving them back the pain they gave me, I absorb the pain into myself with God's help."

- Follow Jesus: What does this passage teach me about God?
- Live life to the full: What does this passage teach me about myself?
- Make a difference: What is God inviting you to do or change as a result of what we have discussed?
 (You can give everyone a minute or so in silence to write it down) Spend some time praying for one another.
